
P: Let us pray . . . All (sing): Amen

Sermon: Text - Hebrews 4:9-13 NKJV

There remains therefore a rest for the people of God. For he who has entered His rest has himself also ceased from his works as God did from His. Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience. For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account.

Our mission offerings go to our synod—the Church of the Lutheran Confession (CLC). They are used for four major purposes: 1) The work of our Board of Trustees, which is entrusted with the synod's administration and support of our older retirees; 2) The work of our Board of Regent, which is entrusted with the operation of our Immanuel Lutheran High School, College, and Seminary in Eau Claire, Wisconsin; 3) The work of our Board of Missions, which is entrusted with mission outreach both in domestic and foreign fields; and 4) The work of our Board of Education and Publications, which fosters Christian education and produces a variety of spiritual publications, including the *Lutheran Spokesman* and *Daily Rest*.

Our mission goal for synod purposes in 2024 is \$18,500. As of August 31 our total mission giving, which is 13% of our regular giving, amounted to \$11,336.22. All undesignated offerings on October 6 will go to meet or exceed our mission goal for the year.
